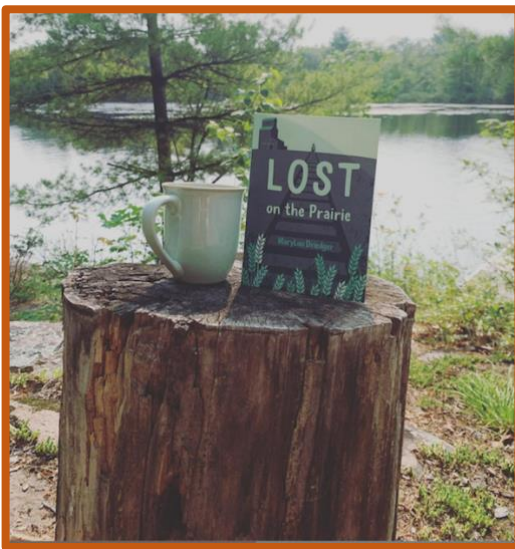
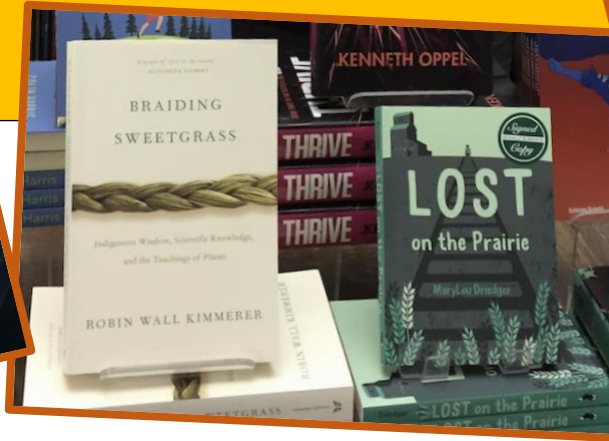


Lost on the Prairie

As I speak with various groups about my book it will be interesting to see what other omissions and errors they find.

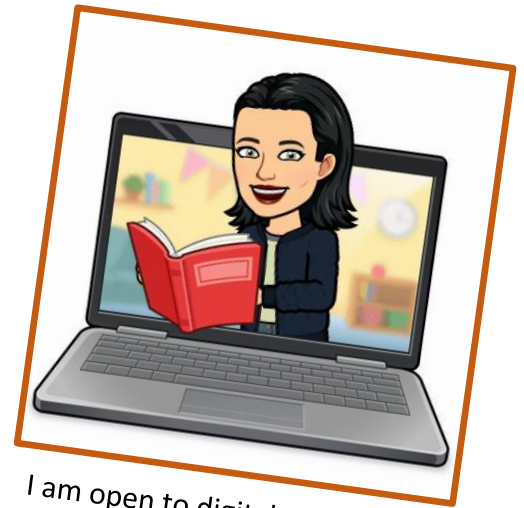
Putting In An Appearance!

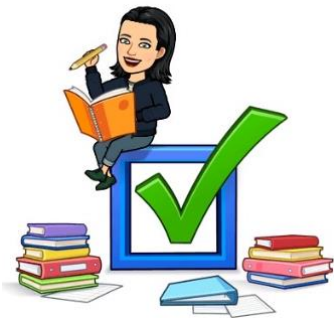
In October I will be the writer interviewed on the blog of author [Caroline Starr](#).
